A Question Of Suspensions

Some school districts frequently suspend very young children while others rarely do so. Districts are required to report inside and outside suspensions to the state for violent offenses only. The actual numbers of suspensions of young children are higher but exact figures were not available. A sampling of the number of suspensions from a few districts from 2003-04 (the latest available year):

YOUNG CHILDREN SUSPENDED

In 2003-2004, Hartford school officials suspended students in prekindergarten, kindergarten and first grade a total of 547 times. They were required to report 257 of the inside and outside suspensions to the state because of the violent nature of the offenses. A breakdown follows of those offenses in Hartford for 2003-2004, the last year for which statistics are available:
