

INTRODUCTION TO THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The following section illustrates, in detail, the expenditures and revenues within the Capital Budget appropriation. The Capital Budget and the General Fund are the only two funds appropriated by the City Council.

The City of Hartford's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is designed to implement many of the long-range objectives of the Hartford Plan of Development adopted by the Commission on the City Plan in 1996.

MANAGEMENT CONSIDERATIONS

The Fiscal Years 2010-2011 through 2019-2020 Recommended Capital Improvement Plan strives to balance and distribute limited resources to meet the City's most critical needs over the next 10 years. The primary emphasis is to preserve the existing infrastructure. While the City of Hartford looks cautiously forward to new and creative development efforts to stimulate the City's economy and tax base, it is important to maintain fiscal conservatism. This poses a challenge to City leaders who must seek to preserve and improve the existing physical plant so that the City's operating departments, Hartford Public School System, and the Hartford Public Library may effectively deliver services. The Recommended Capital Improvement Plan was developed in consideration of the following factors:

- Infrastructure Preservation
- Maintaining and improving the City's park system
- Subsidizing project costs with Federal Stimulus Funds
- Prudent financial planning

FUNDING REQUEST

A Capital Improvement Fund Appropriation Ordinance in the amount of \$23,507,000 is included in the Legal Documents Section. The City makes every attempt to finance the Capital Improvement Program through the use of outside funding sources such as Federal and State grants and Hartford Parks Trust Funds (HPTF).

CATEGORY OVERVIEW

The Capital Improvement Program, funded through the Capital Budget appropriation, was reviewed with department managers for possible impacts on operating budgets and services. The projects fall into one of five major project categories: Public Facilities, Parks and Recreation, Infrastructure, Development and Educational Facilities. Below projects are identified within their category stating financial impacts on current and future year budgets as well as non-financial impacts on services.

Public Facilities

The Public Facilities capital improvement projects are designed to maintain, improve and construct all municipal public facilities. Public Facilities projects primarily focus on the repair, restoration and renovation of existing facilities, however at times new construction will take place.

Parks and Recreation

The Parks and Recreation capital improvement projects are designed to maintain, improve and construct all park facilities. Parks and Recreation projects primarily focus on the repair, restoration and renovation of existing park facilities, however at times new construction will take place. Of the multiple planned projects a few will slightly impact current and future operating costs. The City has the Recreation Division and Office for Youth Services already in place to meet additional service needs and the Public Works Department to maintain the additional fields, the future operating impact will not be substantial. In addition, the fields will have a non-financial impact on services by providing added recreation opportunities.

Infrastructure

The Infrastructure capital improvement projects are designed to maintain, improve and construct the City's fundamental facilities, services and installations needed for the functioning of the City. Infrastructure projects primarily focus on the repair, restoration and renovation of existing infrastructures, however at times new construction will take place.

Development

The Development capital improvement projects are to promote and enhance the orderly growth and development of the city including property acquisitions and deposition.

Education Facilities

The Education Facilities capital improvement projects are designed to maintain, improve and construct the City's public schools. Education Facilities projects primarily focus on the repair, restoration and renovation of existing schools, however at times new construction will take place. The decision to construct the new schools is based upon demographic information and the desire to provide additional education specialization options for City students. The construction of the new schools will impact future operating costs such as: staffing, supplies, information systems, computers, software, phones, minor repairs, textbooks, library materials and other materials needed for educational purposes. In addition, the schools will have a non-financial impact on services by providing education specialization opportunities, smaller class sizes and after-school activities. These after-school activities include but not limited to: basketball, table games, computer use and arts and crafts.

Project Description

The Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is designed to meet the 10-year capital needs of the City in the areas of Public Facilities, Parks and Recreational, Infrastructure, Development and Educational Facilities. The City's investment in these facilities will aid educational programs, strengthen neighborhoods, enhance public safety, and foster economic development.

The following are summaries of Capital Improvement Program projects. Detailed information can be obtained from the individual departments.

Public Facilities

Pope Park Recreation Center Building Shell

This project calls for the replacement of damaged exterior components including roofing and wall surfaces currently allowing water penetration and damages to Pope Park Recreation Center.

Energy Projects

These projects will install energy efficient lighting, high efficiency HVAC units, pumps and motors. Also retro commissioning of existing buildings, upgrade and/or integration of building automation controls for increased efficiency and occupant comfort. Energy audits for project prioritization.

525 Main Street Roof Top Unit Replacement

This project calls for the replacement of the existing roof top units at 525 Main Street. They are not functioning properly and are past their normal life expectancy. New roof top units will provide enhanced air flow in a more energy efficient manner.

Upper Albany - John E. Rogers Cultural Center

This project is a renovation of the former Northwest Jones School into the John Rogers Community and Cultural Center.

Fire Station Renovations

This project calls for the renovation of the existing Fire Houses throughout the city.

Parkville Community Library

Improvements and an addition to the Parkville Community Library are under design.

North End Senior Center Renovation and Addition

This project is a renovation and expansion of an existing building. Interior areas include the kitchen, multi-purpose room, arts and crafts room and HVAC improvements. A 1500 square foot addition provides for a new community room, additional storage and an expansion to the existing exercise area. The project also includes some parking lot and courtyard site improvements.

Keney Clock Tower Renovation

This project aims to restore the Keney Clock Tower.

Completion of Pulaski Pedestrian Mall

This project will complete the Pulaski Pedestrian Mall.

550 Main Street ADA Improvements

This project calls for modifications to existing entrances, accessible paths, elevators, bathrooms, drinking fountains, doors, counters and interior layouts at 550 Main Street as required by the Department of Justice Settlement Agreement reached with the City of Hartford in July 2005.

550 Main Street Exterior Improvements

This project calls for roof replacements, restoration of the exterior doors and windows and masonry restoration and cleaning at 550 Main Street.

Blue Hills Recreation Center- New Building

This is a project to provide an approximately 10,000 square foot recreation center to serve recreation programs and community needs. The program calls for the demolition of the existing deteriorated center and construction of an all new Blue Hills Recreation Center and associated site work.

550 Main Street Mechanical

This project calls for the conversion of all air conditioning systems from window units to central or individual console units throughout the entire building at 550 Main Street. Existing older FCU are to be replaced with newer energy efficient units throughout. Addition of new mechanical units in fourth floor spaces above Council Chambers and Function Room will provide air conditioning to these spaces. Project includes all new water and condensate piping distribution throughout utilizing existing building chases.

550 Main Life Safety Improvements

This project calls for Life Safety Improvements throughout 550 Main Street as required by the Hartford Fire Marshall's Office. Specifically mandated items address sprinkler systems, heat and smoke detection, emergency lighting, fire alarm, exit signs and means of egress. This project will provide shaft entrances and platforms at all levels, relocated and updated electrical panels, standpipes and risers, fire alarm and sprinkler mains and fire alarm and sprinkler distribution in basement and fourth floor areas.

Roof Replacement at Various City Buildings

This project is a continuation of the roof replacement project.

Energy Projects

These projects will install energy efficient lighting, high efficiency HVAC units, pumps and motors. Also retro commissioning of existing buildings, upgrade and/or integration of building automation controls for increased efficiency and occupant comfort, and energy audits for project prioritization.

Parks and Recreation**Old North Cemetery Improvements**

This is a continuation of an existing project to restore the historic monuments, markers, memorials, vaults and buildings in the North Cemetery based on the Master Plan. It also includes lawn irrigation, new lawns, walkways and landscaping.

Batterson Park Infrastructure Improvements

Highest priority is upgrades to various infrastructure components including the Main Dam, Secondary Dam, and related components; Bath Houses and other Facilities need total rebuild; Parking and site amenities need improvement including new picnic areas, playgrounds, care taker's house, etc; Water quality improvements needed due to build up of sediment/pollutants.

Spray Pools and Playgrounds- Hyland Park

This project calls for the removal of the existing spray pool and playground at Hyland Park. They are to be replaced with a new on-demand spray pool and a new playground with a poured safety surface.

I-Quilt/Bushnell Park

The I-Quilt /Bushnell Park project furthers the community engagement process, economic impact analysis, and development of plans for improvements at Bushnell Park. It also provides for the implementation of a wayfinding signage program in the downtown.

Park River Greenway

In response to the Plan of Development's call for the development of greenway trails within the city, this proposal aims to construct two greenways in Hartford. The Park River Greenway will run along the south branch of the Park River from Newfield Avenue to Hamilton Street. This multi-use trail will be 1.8 miles long and used by cyclists, rollerbladers, joggers and walkers. The first phase of the Park River Greenway will be funded by a grant of \$500,000 from DEP.

Pope Park Recreation Center Phase IV

This project calls for new entrances at Park Terrace and Park Street, Park Street and Laurel Street, new accessible walkways throughout, landscaping improvements, open lawn areas, picnic and seating areas and an overlook.

Bushnell Park Vehicle Access Control and Erosion Control Measures

This project would put controls in place to limit vehicle access, widen internal walkways to accommodate limited vehicular traffic, and permanently repair eroded areas in Bushnell Park.

Keney Park Pavilion

This project calls for investigating potential locations within Keney Park for a Pavilion structure that would accommodate 350 persons for large company or family picnic events.

Ancient Burial Ground Improvements

This project calls for the restoration of the historic monuments, markers, memorials and vaults in the Ancient Burying Ground based on a Master Plan that is currently being developed. It also includes new drainage, new lawns, walkways, fence and wall restoration and landscaping.

Athletic Field Improvement- Keney Waverly Baseball Field

This is a continuation of an existing project to re-furbish existing fields including the existing baseball field and to improve the existing parking lot.

ADA Park Improvements per Department of Justice

This project provides accessible parking, walkways and program access as required by the Department of Justice Settlement Agreement reached with the City of Hartford in July 2005.

Athletic Field Improvement- Colt Baseball Field #9

This project calls for the complete refurbishment of the existing Baseball Field # 9 at Colt Park. It includes accessible pathways, drainage, fencing, new playing surface, and other improvements.

Athletic Field Improvement- Cronin Soccer Football Field

This project calls for the complete refurbishment of the existing Soccer Field at Cronin Park. It includes accessible pathways, drainage, new playing surface, seating, and other improvements.

Athletic Field Improvement- Keney Barbour Cricket Field #1

This project calls for the complete refurbishment of the existing Cricket Field at Keney Park. It includes accessible pathways, drainage, new playing surface, and other improvements.

Athletic Field Improvement- Pope Park

This project calls for the complete refurbishment of the existing Soccer Field at Pope Park. It includes accessible pathways, drainage, new playing surface, seating, and other improvements.

Goodwin Park- Spray Pool and Basketball Court

This project calls for the removal of the existing spray pool and basketball court at Goodwin Park. They are to be replaced with a new on-demand spray pool and a basketball court.

Spray Pools and Playgrounds-Day Park

This project calls for the removal of the existing spray pool and playground at Day Park. They are to be replaced with a new on-demand spray pool and a new playground with a poured safety surface.

Spray Pools and Playgrounds - Elizabeth Park

This project calls for the replacement of the existing playground at Elizabeth Park with a new playground with a poured safety surface. It also includes construction of a new on-demand spray pool.

Spray Pools and Playgrounds- Keney Waverly Park

This project calls for the removal of the existing spray pool and playground at Keney Waverly Park. They are to be replaced with a new on-demand spray pool and a new playground with a poured safety surface.

Spray Pools and Playgrounds-Sigourney Park

This project calls for the removal of the existing spray pool and playground at Sigourney Park. They are to be replaced with a new on-demand spray pool and a new playground with a poured safety surface.

Historic Markers

This project calls for the installation of historic markers throughout the City to encourage walking tours and other forms of history related tourism.

Urban Forestry, Recreation and Park Improvements

A study by the Trust for Public Lands, documented what has been well known. Our parks desperately need an infusion of park maintenance and upgrade. Economic stimulus funds would be used for urban forestry and park improvement such as road and trail maintenance and educational programs. City parks targeted are Colt Park, adjacent to the Colt National Landmark, and Keney Park in north Hartford. Keney Park could benefit from thinning out the brush and by raising the canopy along the frontage of the neighborhoods. This would give the park back to its neighbors.

Citywide Playground Enhancements

This project will allow for ongoing upgrades at City playgrounds.

Infrastructure

Repair of 12 City Bridges

The City has 12 bridges that need various levels of repair. A study has been completed that identifies the various repairs needed. The \$100,000 balance in the center for the "Study"

will fund the design work and preparation of construction documents so that the work can be bid and constructed in years 2 and 3 under this center.

Sidewalk Replacement

Perform Annual Sidewalk Program for the 2010/2011 Fiscal year for City owned walks and for privately maintained walks where owners have not complied.

Traffic Signals & Cameras

This program is to install new traffic signals and replace existing signals and other electronic equipment due to obsolescence. Also replace non functioning traffic cameras. This program is to ensure continued functionality of 250 +/- critical signalized locations in Hartford's traffic control network, and to keep Hartford on the cutting edge of signal technology.

Street Rehabilitation and Road Improvements

Perform Annual Street Pavement Mill and Overlay Project for the 2010/2011 Fiscal year, including a re-rating of all streets for the 5 year update of the "Road Manager" database.

Pope Commons Streetscape Improvement

This project will improve the City's Street Infrastructure by enhancing the aesthetic, functional, and safety aspects through streetscaping of this section of Park Street (Park Terrace to Pope Park Hwy. #4)

Connect Regional, National Trails and Create Multi-Use trails

This project is to development the trails of the East Coast Greenway through the City. Phase One of the multi use trail along the Park River was completed in October 2008. This 1,690 foot section of paved trail extends from Flatbush Avenue to Nilan Street. Phase Two of the trail will run southerly along the Park River from Nilan Street to Newfield Avenue and is expected to be completed in 2010-2011.

Streetlight Replacement

Streetscaping projects over the last 20 years have installed hundreds of decorative lights which are aesthetic improvements, however DPW's operating budget cannot support the expense of replacing decorative lights which cost four times the cost of standard lights, therefore the CIP must fund a replacement program.

Street Reconstruction - Farmington/Broad/Asylum Intersection

Perform Street Reconstruction, including traffic signalization and street alignment modifications, to the intersection of Farmington, Broad, and Asylum Avenues.

Flood Control I-91 Levee/Clarke Dike/Misc Levee Repairs

Refine analysis of under seepage problem discovered during certification, and undertake improvements to control seepage during CT River levels exceeding 100 year flood. Needed for USACE compliance.

Flood Control - Pump Station Improvement

Multiple Pump Station improvement needs were discovered during certification process including Overhaul of Pump Internals, New Mechanical Bar Screens at N & S Meadows, Pond Dredging at N & S Meadows., Suction/Discharge Valve Rehab., and Misc Structural Improvements.

South Green Ornamental Fence

This project will replace deteriorated historic fences in the Old South Cemetery and South Green. These replacements will enhance the appearance and security at these historically significant sites.

Traffic Calming

Install traffic calming features based on analysis and in response to citizen requests to correct traffic problems associated with excessive volume, speed, or accident history.

Brookfield Street Reconstruction

This project is to reconstruct Brookfield Street from Flatbush Avenue to Hamilton Street to complete a portion of the bikeway project. Items to be reconstructed in this project include guiderail replacement, intersection reconfiguration at Flatbush Avenue and the installation of bike lanes on Brookfield Street.

Flood Control

Refine analysis of under seepage problem discovered during certification, and undertake improvements to control seepage during CT River levels exceeding 100 year flood. Needed for USACE compliance.

Flood Control – Pump Station Improvement

Multiple Pump Station improvement needs were discovered during certification process including Overhaul of Pump Internals, New Mechanical Bar Screens at N & S Meadows, Pond Dredging at N & S Meadows, Suction/Discharge Valve Rehab., and Misc Structural Improvements.

Colt Gateway Streetscape Phase 1

Phase 1 of this project will enhance the City's Street Infrastructure by improving the aesthetic, functional, and safety aspects thru streetscaping of sections abutting the Colt complex. Phase 2 will be a separate project that will encompass the resurfacing/landscaping of a parking area on Colt property totaling \$1M.

Albany Avenue Safety Improvements

Limits of complete Streetscape and Safety Improvement project is on Albany Avenue from Homestead to Bedford Street. Phase 1 is reduced in scope and is tentatively envisioned as extending from Blue Hills Ave to Garden Street. This is a State DOT project with local match.

Roadside Safety Improvement

This program is to replace or install important roadside safety features such as guiderails, parapets, drainage, center islands, and other features. This program is to ensure continued safety and functionality of Hartford's street network. Project will occur in years 3, 4 and 5.

Implement a Pedestrian Wayfinding Signage Program

This project consists of designing and implementing a wayfinding signage system to allow residents and visitors an easy way to navigate the city via foot.

Citywide Bike Lanes

This project is to design an urban bicycle network that connects Hartford neighborhoods, employment and shopping centers, parks and regional transportation networks. The project also consists of creating bike lanes, widening shoulders, widening outside lanes for bicycle access. Bicycle parking facilities with a mix of lockers and racks is also planned as part of the project as well as shower facilities convenient to employment locations.

Citywide Streetscapes

This project is the ongoing streetscape improvement program planned for major arteries of the City.

2010 Trident Projects

These projects consists of implementing the recommendations that came out of the Hartford 2010 Trident committee report including recommendations made regarding the Farmington Avenue/Asylum Avenue/Broad Street realignment, South Green traffic improvements, Terry Square economic development initiatives, Homestead Avenue Brownfield redevelopment and the Main Street streetscape project and associated improvements.

Bridge Repair

The City has 12 bridges that need various levels of repair. A study has been completed that identifies the various repairs needed. The \$100,000 balance in the centre for the "Study" will fund the design work and preparation of construction documents so that the work can be bid and constructed in years 2 and 3 under this center.

Development

Enhance the Founders Bridge gateway, convert Columbus Boulevard between State St and Talcott St and Market St between Kinsley St and State St to two-way streets

The project involves converting Columbus Blvd. to two-way traffic flow operations between State Street and Talcott Street. This project will improve access to the parking garages/commercial uses and reduce recirculating traffic associated with Market Street/Columbus Blvd one-way couple. This will reinforce the gateway concept of the Founders Bridge area and also support improved connectivity from this area to the Science Museum and Convention Center. This project needs to be completed in tandem with the Market Street project to satisfy traffic demands

Federal/State Grant Matching Fund

This item covers the federal and state grant matching funds the City needs to provide to secure grant opportunities.

Redevelopment Plan Implementation

This allocation will provide funds as required to implement the three redevelopment plans adopted by The Court of Common Council in 2009 at Downtown West, Downtown North and Constitution Plaza East.

Neighborhood Development Fund

This multi-year fund has been created to spur the rehabilitation of blighted buildings in six Neighborhood Investment Areas that contain the heaviest concentration of boarded buildings. Portions of these areas are located in the Northeast, Upper Albany, Clay Arsenal, South Green, Barry Square, Parkville, Frog Hollow, and Behind the Rocks neighborhoods. \$ 2 million has been approved

Economic Development Site Acquisition & Development

This fund provides for an Economic Development Site Acquisition Revolving Fund to meet emerging needs in a timely fashion.

Parkville Municipal Development Plan

This project begins improvements that were identified in the Parkville Municipal Development Plan. See www.hartford.gov/Development/planning for more information.

Convert North Chapel St between High St and Pleasant St to two-way street Convert the following to two-way streets: Asylum St between Ford St & Trumbull St

This project involves converting Asylum Street to two-way traffic flow operations between Trumbull Street and Ford Street. This project provides improved access to the downtown from the west and significantly improves the overall pedestrian environment of this section of Asylum Street. This project will also establish a strong downtown east-west corridor to complement the north-south corridors of Main Street and Trumbull Street.

Modify the intersection of Market, Morgan and North Chapel

This project introduces an additional turning lane and modifies signal timing/phasing to optimize peak period traffic operations that are currently at gridlock.

Former Lyric Theater Building

This project includes base building improvements to 585 Park Street (remaining portion of theater) and site improvements to 856 Broad Street as a means of facilitating its redevelopment.

Educational Facilities

Weaver High School (Culinary Arts and Programs to be Determined)

Renovated three schools as new. One school being a culinary arts school, the other two to be determined.

MLK Program at Fox Middle School

Fox Middle School will become Achievement First K-8 and the building will be renovated as new.

Achievement First at Fox Middle

Fox Middle School will become Achievement First K-8 and the building will be renovated as new.

Bulkeley High School

Renovate as new, it will house the upper school and lower school and the teacher preparation program.

West Middle School

Renovate as new due to enrollment capacity to upgrade the schools.

Breakthrough II at Twain

Former Twain Elementary school renovate as new due character education K-8.

Wish Elementary

Renovate as new to accommodate the K-8 program.

Betances

Renovate as new to accommodated preK- 3 early literacy program.

Roofing, parking lots, and alarm

Based upon needs and expansion of system.
