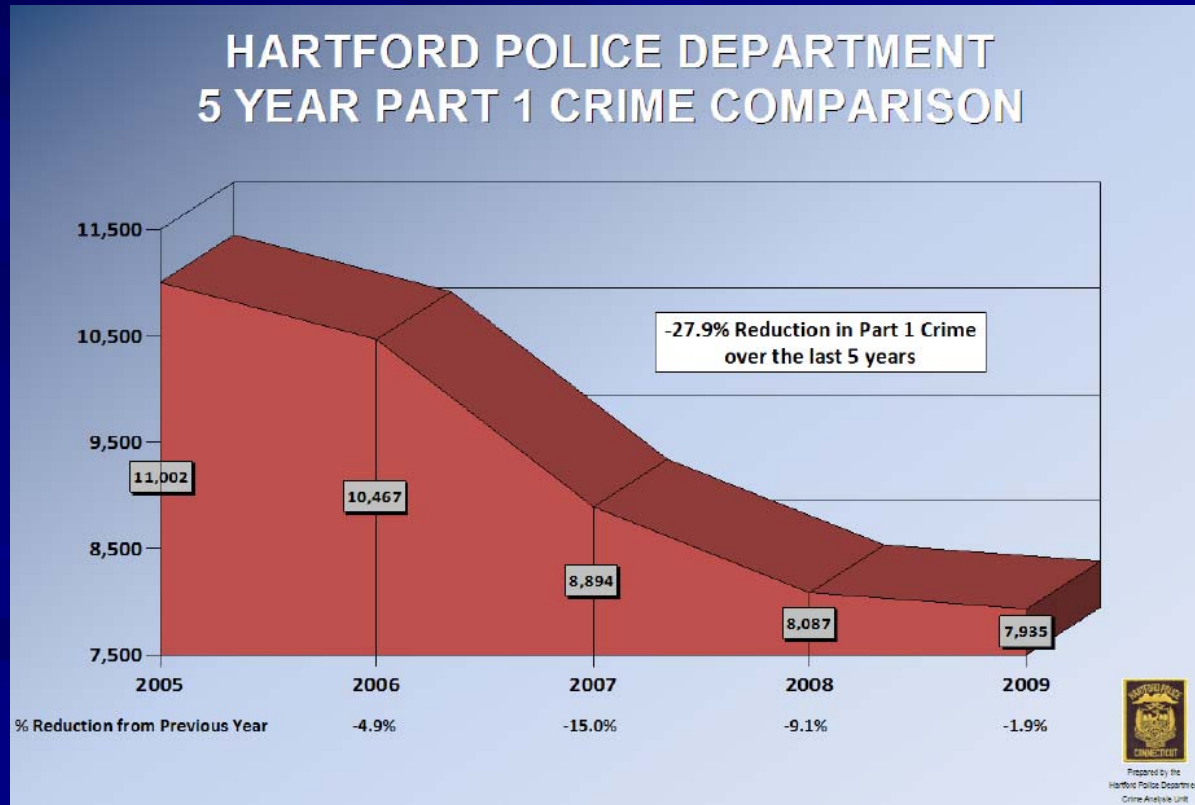

Relentless follow-up and assessment of crime trends and strategies to ensure desired results –



2009 Safe City Overview

- Part One Crime continued to decrease to historic low of 7,935 a 1.9 % decrease; 152 fewer than in 2008
- 24.3 % decrease in Rape
- 24.7 % decrease in Auto Theft
- .6 % decrease in Larceny

2009 Safe City Overview

Despite these historic lows violent crime continues to be a challenge and concern:

- 33 Homicides, increase of 1 over 2008
- Aggravated Assaults increased 16.2 %
- 32.4 % of Aggravated Assaults were domestic related
- Burglaries increased 12 %
- Shooting incidents increased 9.2 %

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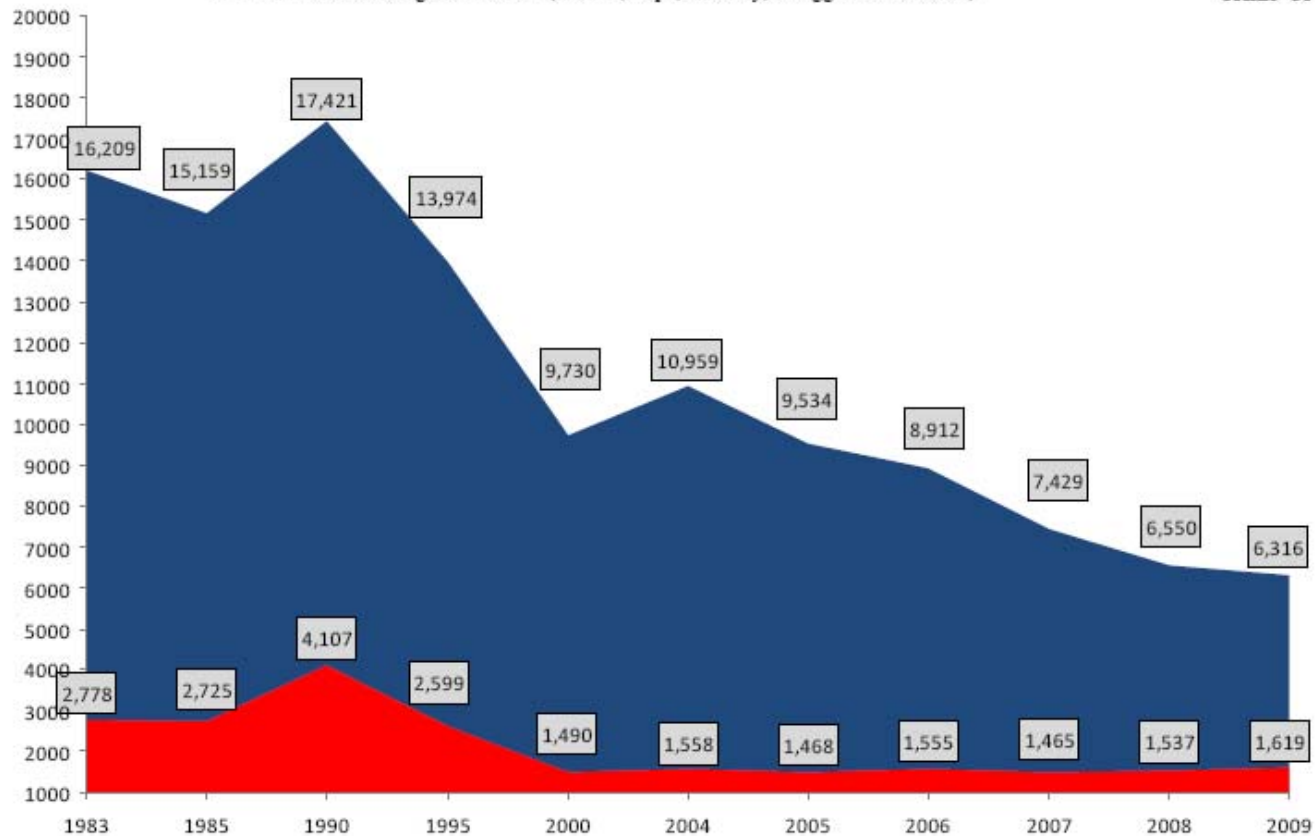

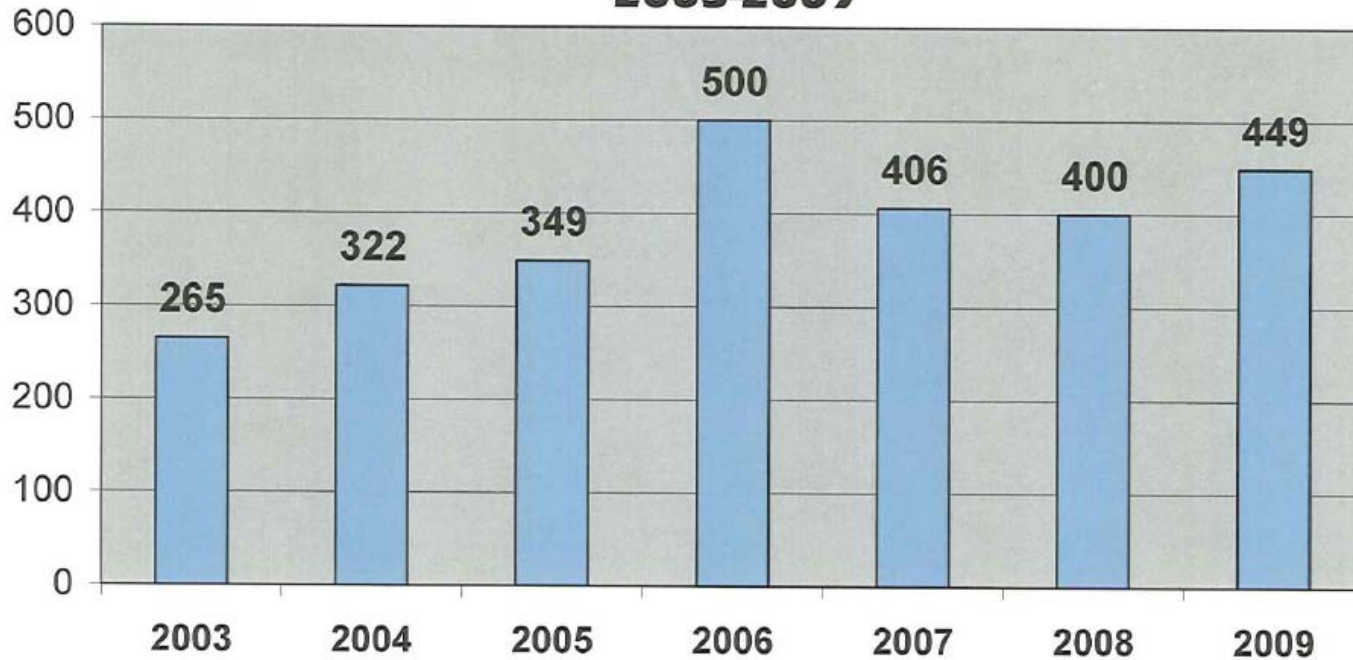
Violent and Property Crime Comparison

- Violent Crime increased by 5.3 %
- Property Crime decreased 3.6 %
- Since 2003 Property Crime decreased from 10,959 to 6,316, representing a 44 % decrease
- Since 2003 Violent Crime has remained constant and in 2009 increased from 1,537 to 1,619

Crime Suppression Strategies; Increased Enforcement

- Part One arrest activity increased by 6.6 percent
- Burglary arrests increased by 34.1 percent
- Aggravated Assault arrests increased by 30.6 percent
- 449 Guns seized and 212 firearm related arrests

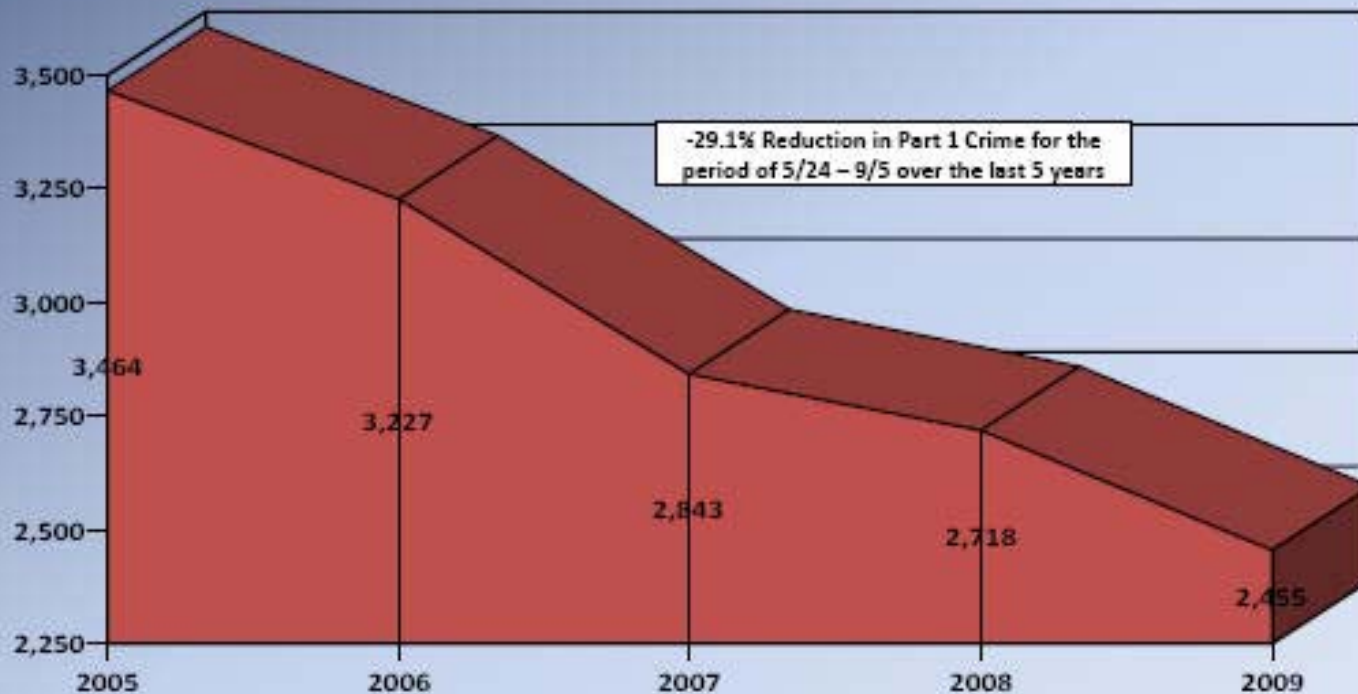

- **Implementation of the Hartford Police Department's Domestic Violence Unit -**
Nearly 33 percent of all Aggravated Assaults are domestic violence related
- **Introduction of Tasers** – Tasers will lessen personal injury exposure to the city for both employees and suspects
Status: Tasers on order ; training underway.

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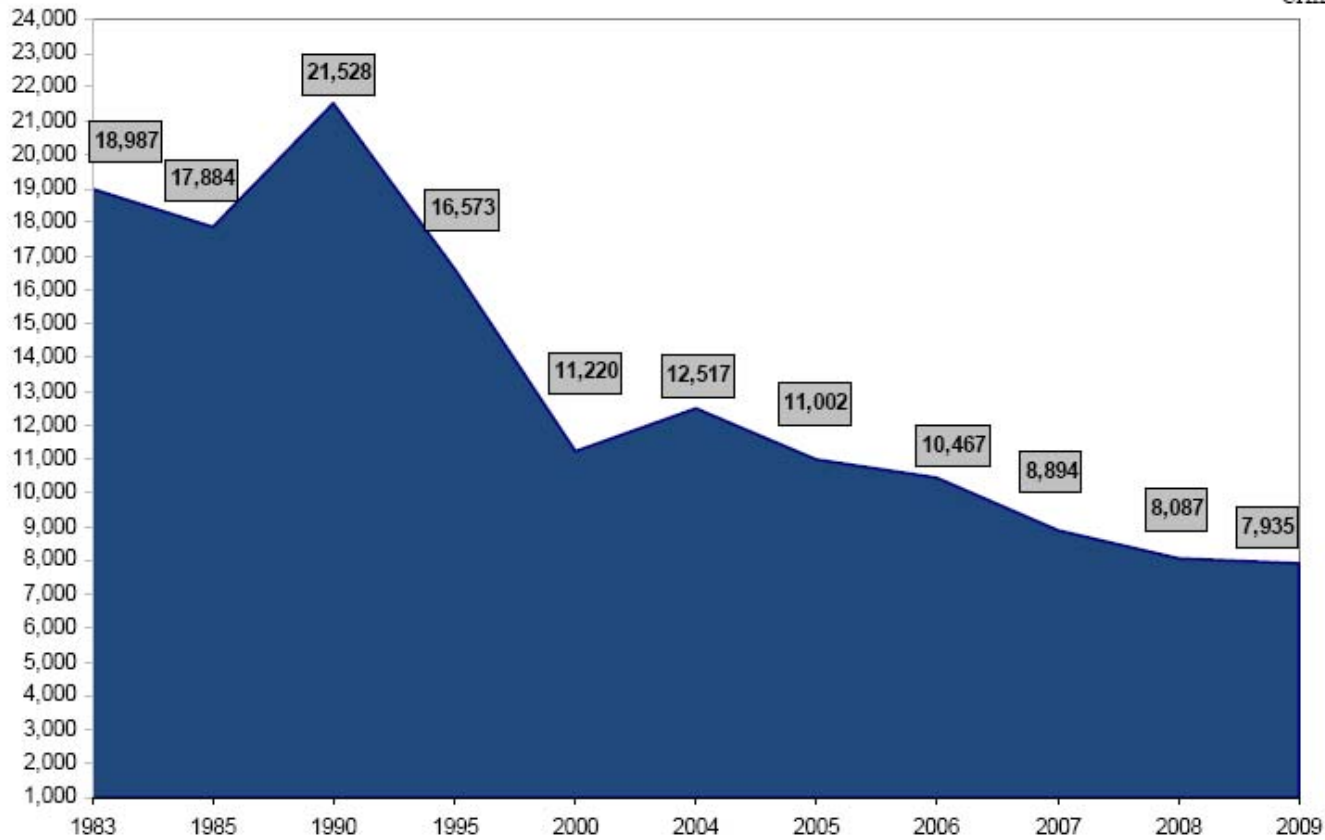
