**2009-2010 Funding Allocations for Agencies through
City Council Civic & Cultural Affairs**

- WHEREAS,** The following community-based organizations and initiatives provide critical community services, advocacy and benefits to Hartford residents, businesses, and institutions; and
- WHEREAS,** These organizations support a diverse set of activities and needs in various parts of the community, yet taken together provide initiatives throughout the city; and
- WHEREAS,** Such outcomes as improved quality of life, improved civic participation, improved community and economic conditions, fostering communication on city initiatives, and other positive outcomes are realized through these agencies and programs; and therefore be it
- RESOLVED,** That the Court of Common Council make the allocations to agencies on the attached page: and be it further
- RESOLVED,** That each agency must submit to the chief operating officer the following scope of services and documents that assures (1) a work plan with clear objectives, strategies and timelines; (2) evidence of past and present track record aligned to the work plan activities; (3) the most recent audited set of financial records showing demonstrated strong financial conditions; and be it further
- RESOLVED,** Each agency will be required to choose an independent intermediary (as certified through the City Council's OMB Committee, including such intermediaries as LISC, Hartford 2000, Neighborhood Centers, UCAN, etc.) that has previous or past demonstrated experience in financial oversight and monitoring to provide ongoing independent support an validation of work through quarterly reports to the city council through the COO, or the COO's designated staff.
